- Continuing to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference books or textbooks.
- In narratives, describing settings, characters and atmosphere and integrating dialogue to convey character and advance the action.
- Using a wide range of devices to build cohesion within and across paragraphs.
- Ensuring the consistent and correct use of tense throughout a piece of writing.
- using relative clauses beginning with who, which, where, when, whose, that or with an implied (ie omitted) relative pronoun
- Using commas to clarify meaning or avoid ambiguity in writing.

Science - Living Things and Their Habitats

- Recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways.
- Explore and use classification keys to help group,
- Identify and name a variety of living things in their **local** and wider **environment**.
- Describe the differences in the cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird.
- Discuss the life cycles of reproduction in some plants and animals.

Maths - Fractions

- Recognise and show, using diagrams, families of common equivalent fractions
- Count up and down in hundredths; recognise that hundredths arise when dividing an object by 100 and dividing tenths by 10
- Solve problems involving increasingly harder fractions to calculate quantities, and fractions to divide quantities, including non-unit fractions where the answer is a whole number
- Add and subtract fractions with the same denominator.
- Multiply proper fractions and mixed numbers by whole numbers, supported by materials and diagrams
- Read and write decimal numbers as fractions
