



## Annual SEND Report 2023

### SEND profile:

The number of pupils on the SEN Register is now 15 which equates to 14.8% of the school population.

The National figure for pupils on SEN Support is currently 12% (Jan 23)

Lincolnshire's figure is 12.6% (Jan 23)

Pupils with an EHCP in our school is 4 which equates to 3.9%.

The National figure for pupils with an EHCP is 3.6%

Lincolnshire's figure is 4.2%

Children's needs may be categorised into four band areas, these include:

1. Communication and Interaction/Autism (27%)
2. Cognition and Learning (60%)
3. Social, Emotional and Mental Health (7%)
4. Sensory and/or Physical (6%)

The percentages at the side of these areas show how our children experience SEN at St Bartholomew's. Some children do experience more than one area of need, so these percentages are based on their **main area**.

46% of Pupil Premium children at St Bartholomew's are also on the SEND register.

1 child has been removed from the register so far this year.

6 children have been added to the register. 1 arrived with an EHCP in Reception. 3 of these children entered St Bartholomew's already on the SEND register. 2 children have been added after a period of monitoring following our Graduated Approach.

### Statement regarding overall quality of provision for pupils with SEND

Any child identified on the SEND register receives additional support. This is outlined on Pupil Record Cards and a whole school provision map, which is written in conjunction with the Class Teachers and Teaching Assistants and is updated regularly. Teachers are all responsible for providing a high quality of education for our SEND pupils and are supported by the SENCO through a SEND staff meeting every term. Teachers, in partnership with pupils and parents set



targets and these are recorded on a child friendly plan. These plans are always accessible to the children and are positioned on tables for easy access. Targets are written using child friendly language. Teachers, pupils and parents use these plans to support the achievement of these SMART targets through a range of intervention strategies. The cycle of Assess, Plan, Do, Review is followed; parents are included in target setting at least three times a year.

Processes for SEND are clear and progressive. All SEND pupils have access to the school curriculum and adaptations are in place to support this where necessary. (Evidence: LA Visit Report). ELSA support is made available for children with social and emotional needs.

### SEN policy

The SEN Policy was reviewed in March 2023 and the following changes were made:

### SEN information report on school website

The SEN Information Report was reviewed in September 2022 and is reviewed annually. It is available on the school's website and includes information about Lincolnshire's Local Offer.

### Statutory assessments

Pupils with SEND have access arrangements made for them by the Headteacher to enable access to the SATs test in Years 2 and Year 6. This includes extra time to allow for processing difficulties or speed of handwriting. SATs tests in Maths and Grammar and Punctuation can be read to the pupil and in some cases, answers can be scribed. At St Bartholomew's we always apply for whatever is necessary to meet the pupils needs.

### Accessibility plan

The Accessibility Plan was reviewed in September 2022 and updated.

### SEND budget and spending

All schools receive a Notional Budget of £6000 per pupil towards SEND pupils within school. This is awarded annually. If an pupil has an EHCP then we also receive a 'top up' funding allocation depending on the level of need. The SEND budget is planned out carefully to ensure needs are met.

### Staffing for SEND

To support a pupil with SEMH needs, a 1:1 Teaching Assistant has been deployed since October 2022. All children with EHCPs are supported to match the total number of hours provided on the



EHCP. Teaching Assistants all spend time delivering a range of interventions throughout the school to meet a range of needs.

#### **CPD for SEND**

All staff have had CPD on the following:

- SPLD and best practice
- Effective Target Setting for pupils with SEND
- Inclusion and the Four Areas of Need

More CPD is planned to be delivered by the Specialist Teaching Team in the Summer Term 2023.

#### **Pupil voice**

With the implementation of child friendly plans this year, all pupils have been given the opportunity to share what they find difficult, how they like to learn and what they need to do to succeed. Some pupils who struggle with communication and interaction are also included in the process through visual images or a sliding scale using numbers 1 to 10.

#### **Parent/carer voice**

At St Bartholomew's parent voice is always listened to. During target setting, parental suggestions are encouraged. All targets must be agreed by pupil, parent and Teacher before plans are implemented.

A parent voice questionnaire will be sent out in April to gather opinions and perceptions of SEND provision in our school.

#### **External agencies**

At St Bartholomew's we work with a range of external agencies to ensure the needs of our pupils are met.

Currently we work with:

- Paediatricians
- Specialist Teaching Team
- Educational Psychologists
- Visual Processing Clinic
- Occupational Therapy
- Physiotherapy
- Heathy Minds
- Working Together Team
- Lincolnshire County Council SEND Team
- Young Carers
- Health Visitors
- Early Help Workers

This list is by no means extensive. If a pupil needs other external agency involvement, referrals are completed. Relationships with external agencies are positive.

#### **Any other developments regarding SEND?**

- Child Friendly Plans have now been implemented
- Some referrals made have diagnosed needs to enable efficient support



- Pupil Voice is a focus for our SEND pupils
- Adaptive techniques are being implemented and reviewed regularly
- SENCO working towards NASENCO Award this year
- CPD by Specialists planned in for the Summer Term

Next Step is to transition from PIVATs as an assessment tool to Pre-Key Stage.
