

Book Fair






Safety Week: Every year at St Bartholomew's, the children learn about a range of aspects on how to stay safe. This includes a number of visitors who come and speak to the children about what their job entails and what they do to help people stay safe. Safety Week was launched on Monday 16th October by Mrs Davison, who discussed safety in school and what the different coloured lanyards mean that adults in school wear.

This year, we have had online safety workshops in Palm, Oak and Willow class. This is an important safety issue to discuss as technology becomes more and more prominent in our lives. The children in KS2 were surprised to hear, by their visit from PCSO Holland, that they can be held criminally responsible at the age of 10 and how actions have consequences!

Other visits have included a paramedic teaching CPR and what is available in an ambulance. Firefighters discussed safety fire rules in our own homes and KS1 had a lovely visit from a mole and Molsom's Opticians. Oak class had a Car and Helmet Safety Workshop as a reminder of how important it is to wear a seatbelt and a helmet when riding our bicycles on the road. Willow discussed aspects of Substance Abuse at an age

appropriate level.

Apple Class: Apple Class have had an amazing first term! The Reception children have learnt all the set 1 sounds and are working on blending sounds to read words. We use the virtual classroom in school and at home to support gaps in children's sound knowledge and we are so thankful to the parents who use our QR codes at home in order to support their child's development. The majority of the Year 1 children are working on set 3 sounds and progressing well through our Phonics scheme. The children are working their socks off and we are so proud of them.

We enjoyed a trip to Ketton Pumpkins this term. The children learnt about pumpkins, picked and measured pumpkins and also met some farm animals. We had a wonderful time and have included a QR code for you to scan and watch a video of our trip.

Our mud kitchen has been very popular this term. The area has been enhanced with autumn themed resources such as conkers, acorns, pinecones and pumpkins. The children have developed their creative skills by making pumpkin pie, conker cake and mud milkshake. Yummy! Thank you to everyone who sent in natural resources for us to use.

Apple Class managed to fill up one of their pom pom reward jars this term. When the children receive a pom pom (for showing our core values, producing amazing work or generally being a superstar), they vote for a reward by placing the pom pom in a jar of their choice. The first jar that got filled was a trip to the park. We had such fun and developed our gross motor skills and friendship skills while we were there. Well done Apple Class! 🕃

Palm Class: At the start of the new year Palm class were visited by a troll who left a book about himself for the children the read. Throughout the term, we have been learning about the troll's life and friends and finding exciting adjectives to describe him. At the end of learning about the troll, Palm class drew their own troll and wrote beautiful narratives about their troll.


In maths, Palm class have been revising their place value and have just started to learn their addition and subtraction. Year 2 have focused on numbers to 100, whereas year 3 have focused on numbers to 1000. Pupils within Palm class enjoyed working together to practise

their place value and partitioning of numbers in a practical activity, this term, using our ten frames.

In D.T. this term, Palm class have explored different types of fruit and vegetables, looking at healthy eating and expanding this by creating delicious pumpkin scones. First Palm organised their fruits and vegetables, and then visited pumpkin fields to watch them being harvested. Palm have then cut up pumpkins with adult supervision and then baked this in scones. Many said they were delicious, others explained that they were not keen on pumpkin.

During the end of term, Palm class have partaken in the Harvest festival, singing a beautiful song about vegetables as well as reading a poem together. Palm class have worked extremely hard in preparation for the Harvest Festival and on the 13th of October they performed beautifully. Well Done, Palm.

At the end of this term Palm class have been learning about health and safety, getting lots of visitors from paramedics and firefighters, as well as learning about online and road safety. Palm class have been awesome when visitors have come in and have learnt a great deal this week.


Oak Class: What a busy term we have had in Oak Class! It was an absolute delight to welcome the children back to school in September and to see so many smiling faces. The children were fascinated by their new learning environment and are developing new friendships. I am so proud of each member of Oak Class for demonstrating resilience, determination and perseverance to achieve, succeed and truly 'let their light shine'.

The children have learnt all about Queen Victoria as we have begun our in depth study of the Victorian Era. They have been fascinated by the formidable monarch's reign, the impact she had on society in Britain and have even designed their own wallpaper inspired by William Morris. Our 'Sound' topic in Science has proved fascinating, as the children have learnt about sound particles travelling, explored pitch by making their own panpipes and even had a brief venture into sound-proofing. From creating hashtags in English about our daredevil stunt-woman Annie Edson Taylor who was the first woman to venture over Niagara Falls alone, the children have been inspired by her imagination, determination and foolhardiness with beautifully written diary entries and letters.



Finally, the children voted for their Pom-Pom's reward this term to experience a French Café in school. They dressed in the colours of the French Flag, 'le tricolore': rouge, blanc et bleu, shared in a traditional 'petit déjeuner' (breakfast), learnt how to order their food in French using the appropriate vocabulary, played French Garden games and explored vocabulary surrounding safety and people who keep us safe as we came to the end of Safety Week in school.

The children are engaging with our curriculum and I look forward to watching them develop in confidence in pursuit of their personal goals and aspirations. On behalf of the Oak Class Team, I would like to thank our parents and carers for your support, and I hope you all have a wonderful half-term break.

Willow Class: Willow class have been extremely busy this term settling in to Year 6. We all really enjoyed a visit to Peterborough Museum back in September, to learn more about the impact of World War Two on people's lives in Britain. The children put out fires and scooped up incendiary bombs! They also experienced spending time in an actual air raid shelter which had been used during the war. Willow class really enjoyed the day and we learnt lots!



In class, Year 6 have spent the term investigating light. The children conducted an investigation to see what happens to shadows when an object is close to a light source or further away. They used a teddy, a tape measure and a torch and gathered data in a table by applying their maths skills and measuring the size of each shadow created. The results were discussed and the children produced a graph to demonstrate what happened. A conclusion was then written to explain what the data demonstrated. We learnt that the closer the object is to the light source, the larger the shadow.








To end the term, Willow have had a fabulous week learning all about how to keep themselves safe during Safety Week. The children attended an Online Safety Workshop and were taught all about malicious content and the law attached to it. They have been visited by fire fighters and learnt about not overloading sockets and what to do in the rare event of a house fire. Willow class also learned how to do CPR when Trevor the paramedic visited. Lots of learning on how to stay safe.







In DT we have been learning about gears and pulleys. We have studied toys, then designed and made our own using mechanisms.

<u>Clothing Recycling:</u> Our clothes recycling container is situated in the bike shed. This facility is available term time only between 8.30am and 3.30pm. Your donations need to be deposited in a bag, however, please can we ask that you do not leave bags by the locked gates. This is a community facility and therefore is available for the wider community to use.

<u>Pen Recyling:</u> Remember to bring in your old pens, felt pens and markers for recycling.

There is a recycling box in the bike shed. All writing instruments (except for wooden pencils and chalk) are accepted. We cannot accept glue sticks, erasers, rulers or other cutting objects.
