In a time of real need for many of our communities, pupils and families, Harvest is a time to ensure that we too sow the seeds of friendship and support across our school and communities, and never forget to tend to the wider educational seeds and attitudes we plant and cultivate every day.

Thank you to all the families who have donated food for our Harvest Festival. We are so grateful for your generosity and I am sure that Agape will be too. We are all feeling the pinch in our pockets at the moment, but once again you have shown what it means to live well together.
