Good afternoon,

Last year I got a save the date for a wedding for some friends of mine. It may not yet be the official invitation, but I was still excited when I got it. I'm looking forward to celebrating with my friends and loved ones for the day, all dressed up having fun. It got me thinking about what it means to be invitational.

We talk about being invitational a lot in regards to Collective Worship. What does it mean to be invitational in Collective Worship? Well, like a wedding invitation, an invitation to participate in collective worship should be offered to everyone loved and valued by the hosts; in fact, it should encourage everyone to join in because they matter. My friends are inviting everyone they care for, even though some of their invited guests might not approve of the idea of marriage or might not love the idea of a church wedding or might feel horrified at the idea of having to join in the dancing at the reception afterwards: they are invited because they matter. My friends will then do whatever they can to make sure that the wedding is something everyone can enjoy and participate in honestly and authentically.

In the same way, collective worship in school is an invitation for everyone because everyone matters. It is invitation that draws on our relationships with each other as members of the school community and reassures each person that they can join in exactly as they are. I'm sure that when I go to my friend's wedding, there will be parts that I choose to participate in and parts that either I choose not to be involved in or are not specifically for me. Collective worship is the same: some of the adults and children may not feel comfortable praying or perhaps don't believe in what is being shared; however, there should be a place for everyone to be involved in some way. Indeed, it is important that they are there because they are part of the collective whole of the school community; if they were not there, their voice would be missing and the whole school community would lose out. Collective worship in our school should be an opportunity for each person – adult and child – to explore something bigger than themselves, to have an opportunity to consider Christian teachings and the relevance they may or may not hold to our lives, and to bring with them their own beliefs, values and lived experience as part of their spiritual growth. No assumptions, just invitations because each person matters.

Attendance

All schools are expected to keep their attendance over 96%. This term we have dropped to 95.2% I know that this term brings chilly weather and wet mornings, which in turn means more colds and coughs are about, however, if your child has a cold, they should still be in school please.



Dr Chris Whitty released this statement via the DfE this week:

"It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above."

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

MyLOL is a free social networking and dating site aimed at teens. Profiles can publicly display users' images and information, including sexual orientation and personal interests. The service bills itself as "the number one teen dating website in the world", claiming to have more than a million users globally. Despite its popularity, the MyLOL app is no longer available from Google Play or the App Store, although the site is still active. In some countries, police forces and schools have previously warned parents about "sinister predators" and "Inappropriate activities" on the site,

Advice for Parents & Carers

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DISCUSS ONLINE DATING

It's vital to talk to your child about the possible dangers of platforms like MyLOL – particularly the threat of online predators. Remind them of the risks of sharing intimate images and information with strangers and emphasise that most people don't realise they're being 'catfished' until it's too late – it really isn't wise for a young person to meet up with someone they've only spoken to anline.

RESTRICT IN-APP SPENDING

If your child has access to a bank card or other payment method, they may be enticed into signing up for MyLOL's premium features. Having their profile boosted and receiving more attention could be especially tempting if their friends also use the site. You could consider altering th device's settings to disable internet purchases, or at the very least kee an eye on their online spending. ou could consider altering their ases, or at the very least keeping

Before your child begins using a service such as MyLOL, it's important that they understand the potential pitfails of giving out their personal data on this type of platform. Explain to them, for example, that they shouldn't divulge any personally identifying information to people who don't know, as scammers can be quite convincing when attempting to someone's identity.

EXPLAIN PRIVACY RISKS

If you're worried that your child may be planning to meet up with someone they've met on MyLOL, you could consider utilising GPS or WiFi location tracking technology to follow their whereabouts in real time. You can even set up a virtual boundary or 'fence' and opt to receive an alert to your phone if your child enters or exits a specified area.
